Meeting to Review Cafe Licenses

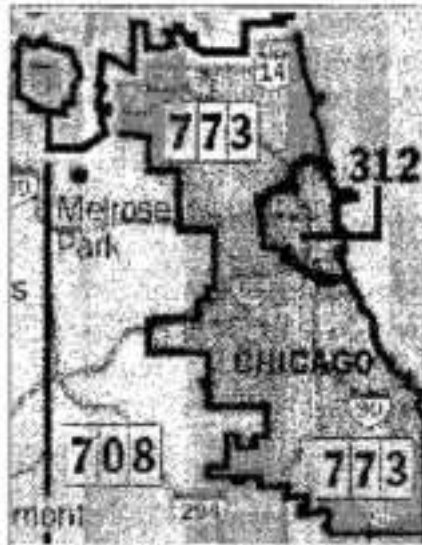

The next general meeting of the Southport Neighbors Association, to be held September 24, 1996, will seek neighbors' input on current and proposed sidewalk cafes in the neighborhood.

Sidewalk cafes have grown in popularity in the past few years. Southport Avenue, Clark Street, and even some side streets now have sidewalk cafes – and there may be more to come in the near future.

A public meeting will be held on September 24, 1996, to review all sidewalk cafes and how they affect our neighborhood. Restaurant owners have been invited to present their plans for the 1997 season, and neighbors will be given a chance to ask questions and voice concerns about each individual cafe – current or proposed.

After hearing the plans and concerns, Southport Neighbors will make a recommendation to the appropriate Alderman as to whether each specific license should be renewed or issued for the summer of 1997.

Cubby Bear Beer Garden Hearing Rescheduled to October 1

A hearing before the License Appeal Commission of the city of Chicago on the Cubby Bear's application for a 100-seat beer garden has been rescheduled to October 1, 1996 at 320 N. Clark Street, Room 507.

Earlier this summer, Winston Mardis, the Local Liquor Control Commission, denied the beer garden license application, as a result of the strong opposition of neighborhood residents. The beer garden proposed by the Cubby Bear's owners calls for covering the parking lot to the west of the building with a wood deck with outdoor seating for approximately

100 people.

The hearing before the License Appeal Commission had been set for September 6. Mr. George Lucas, owner of the Cubby Bear, was present, as were approximately 20 neighborhood residents including members of the SNA, East LakeView Neighbors, and Hawthorne Neighbors. The hearing was rescheduled because no commissioner was present.

Neighbors are encouraged to attend the hearing to express their views on the proposed beer garden and its impact on the neighborhood. For information, call Gary Bonikowski at 871-1331.

Area Code Changing to 773

Homes and businesses in the Southport Neighbors area will be changing their area code to 773 beginning October 12, 1996.

All phone numbers in Chicago except the downtown area will be changing to 773. The area bounded by North Avenue, Western Avenue, 35th Street and the Lake will be retaining 312.

Ameritech says the change was made necessary by the demand for fax, modem, pager and cellular phone numbers. The change will have no effect on phone rates, and 911 can still be dialed as normal. Call Ameritech at 1-800-988-5888 if you have any questions.

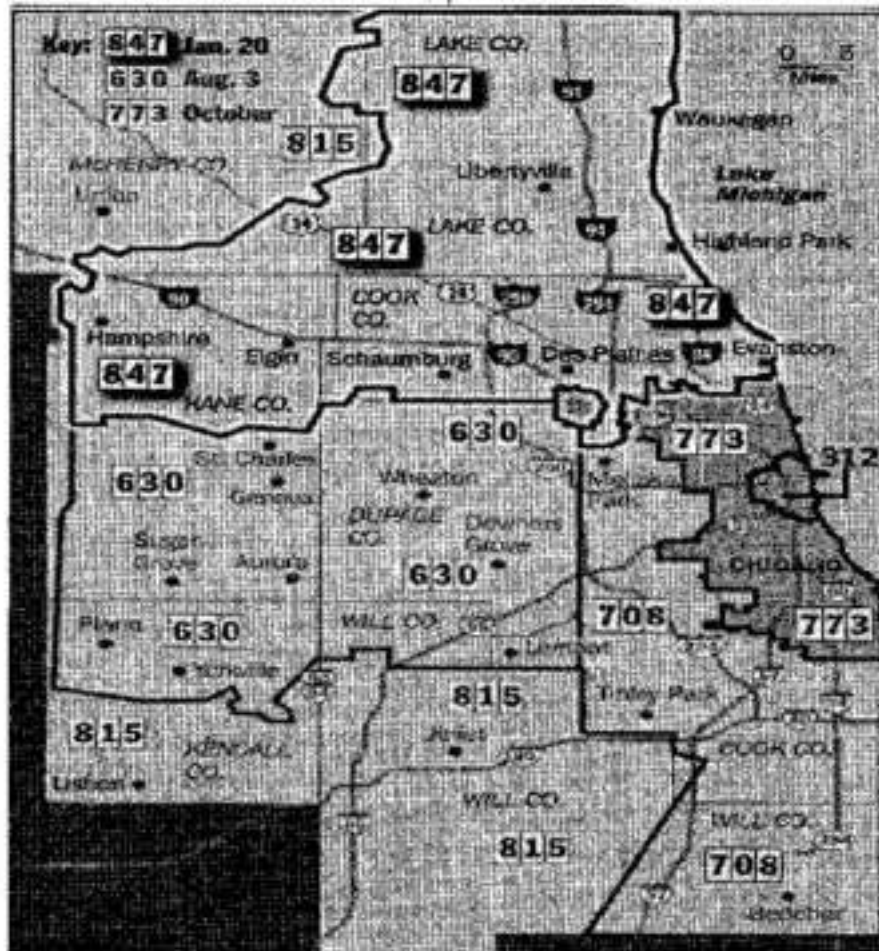

Lake View High School Campus Park Meeting Oct. 1

Alderman Gene Schuler is inviting community residents to attend a meeting October 1 to discuss the new "Campus Park" project for Lake View High School.

Lake View is one of five schools in the City to receive a \$1 million grant for a project designed to bring together and serve the school and surrounding neighborhoods, with athletic fields, recreational space, greenery and playgrounds. The Board of Education and the Chicago Park District have teamed up to execute 11 Campus Parks over the next year.

The meeting, to be held at 7:30 p.m. in the Lake View High School Auditorium (4015 N. Ashland), will give neighborhood residents an opportunity to meet with Park District and City officials, to discuss what kinds of playground equipment would be favored for the neighborhood.

The Department of Transportation, Board of Education, Park District, the Mayor's office and Alderman Schuler's office teamed up with community representatives to bring this project of Lake View High School. The school's track will be refurbished and a park will be created. Later community meetings will focus on other aspects of this project before construction starts next spring.
