Community Meeting Annual Board Elections To Be Held

The meeting will begin at 7:30p.m. There will be a brief presentation by the developer planning to build townhomes on the 3800 block of North Southport, replacing the housing between the Blaine parking lot and the alley to the north. The SNA Planning and Development committee will be making a recommendation on the variance requested by the developer, and the community will be allowed to vote on whether to grant the variance.

We will also be holding our annual SNA Board elections. SNA members will vote on a slate of candidates presented at the meeting. (Please note that you must be a member of SNA for 30 days in order to vote in the board elections.)

We are scheduled to adjourn at 8pm, at which time we will be going next door to Strega Nona for our neighborhood social. You must be a member to participate in the social, but you are welcome to join SNA when you arrive for the meeting.

Directed Development Council (CDDC) has been meeting monthly to discuss the creation of a strategic plan for the 44th Ward. The Council is an advisory body to the Alderman on issues of land use and development in the Ward. The Council has been working on Bylaws and rules governing the Council process and has recently transferred the inventories each neighborhood collected about their housing stock to create zoning maps. These maps are now being reviewed to determine how the

City's new zoning ordinance should

be applied to each neighborhood.

As many of you know, our residential area was previously zoned R-4, but then overlay districts ("Special Districts 4 & 5") were created to limit overdevelopment in the SNA area. Those overlay districts have been reclassified as "R3 ∏" zoning under the new code with only minor changes to the FARs (floor area ratios previously in special districts 4 & 5 were 1,200 sq ft. per unit on a 25 x 125 ft. lot, now they are 1,250 sq. ft. per unit which allows up to 2 dwelling units). Additionally, the new code will require larger garage widths from the current 8', to 9' per

vehicle, side yard setbacks are to be 20% of lot width (5' on a 25'x125' lot) with neither side being less than 8% of the lot width (2' on a 25'x125' lot), yard space 30% of the lot depth (including a garage) with 6.5% of lot area as open space.

After reviewing the Maps, the SNA-CDDC representatives are looking at the use of the 3 ∏ designation for most of our interior streets. However, the SNA representatives to the CDDC are also looking at ways to apply the new code and other preservation tools on select streets to preserve our graystones which are the foundation of our neighborhood, our wide lots with historic homes, and other characteristically significant buildings.

Additionally, the SNA-CDDC representatives are working with the Lakeview Chamber of Commerce and the Sheil Park and West Lakeview Neighbors Associations to develop a strategic plan for Southport. It is the consensus of

these organizations to fully promote Southport as a "Pedestrian street" (the description assigned by the City planners in drafting the new code) and thereby continue to develop and complement the charming boutique retail, gourmet restaurant and high quality theater district with limited placement of ground floor residential buildings. The SNA-CDDC is also looking at ways to become more involved with beautification projects on Southport to address street and building aesthetics to attract more shoppers to our businesses.

CDDC meetings are held on the 4th Wednesday of each month at 6:30p.m. at Ann Sather's Restaurant on Belmont. These meetings are open to the public and the minutes from each meeting are posted on Alderman Tom Tunney's website at www.44thward.org/zoning. There is a place in the neighborhood that could be causing a feeding and gourmet cooking frenzy (and more so once the word is out to faithful readers of the SNA newsletter) -The Southport Grocery and Café! If you have resisted its subtle storefront on Southport slightly south of Addison, resist no more. A Word From Your Elected Officials



Tunney Talk

It seems like spring has finally sprung in Chicago and with it come many changes around the 44th ward. Go Cubbies! The office, which has been closing at 7pm Mondays — Thursdays during the winter, will be open again until 8pm on these nights. This is necessary to accommodate the parking permit issues of the Ward during the Cubs season. LV2, or Cubs night game permits, will be mailed to constituents beginning April 5th. The 44th Ward office will begin distributing them on April 12th. The first night game is May 4th. The City Clerk's office will be selling City of Chicago Vehicle Stickers and Residential Parking Permits (Zone 383) in the 44th Ward office on Monday June 14th and Wednesday June 16th from 9:00am -7:00pm. Current City Stickers and Residential Parking Permits expire on June 30, 2004.

With parking being one

of the main concerns in our ward, I am also working on making improvements on other parking programs. New metered parking guidelines will go into effect throughout the 44th Ward on April 11th. The new Sunday metered parking will affect the following streets: Broadway, Belmont, Clark, Halsted, Southport, Sheffield, Addison and Diversey. Sundays are often the busiest days in the neighborhood and there are many residents and businesses that will benefit from Sunday parking turnover on our streets. Currently, because of the free Sunday parking, many cars sit in the spaces all day and leave residents and business owners no alternative. Parking will continue to cost 25 cents per hour and will now be enforced 7 days a week. Parking meters will be in operation on Sunday between 10am and 8pm.

I'm also looking to make the limited Booting program more customer friendly. Customers will be given at least 10 minutes to get back to their

cars after leaving the private lot before the business can commence the booting process.

Development is another major concern in our ward and it keeps our office very busy. We are working to preserve some wonderful homes and blocks through landmarking and zoning changes. Along with preservation, we are also working to ensure that new development is consistent with its surroundings and representative of the needs of the ward. We are making sure that developers who reach out to us for assistance are meeting with their community/business organizations so that the community is informed and has input into the changes occurring in their areas. I recently hosted an Affordable Housing Breakfast to bring together developers, housing advocates and the City's Department on Housing, to talk about ways to maintain and create affordable housing opportunities in the 44th Ward. The booming development has priced out many of

Letter from Commissioner Quigley

Dear Neighbors:

I'd like to take this opportunity to update you on some of the environmental initiatives my office has been working on in both the County and the Forest Preserve District.

In the County, I have had many environmental successes including the successful passage of a recycling ordinance, a green purchasing ordinance, and green building legislation. In order to continue and enhance those endeavors, I have begun an ongoing project to make Cook County the "greenest" county in the nation. As Chair of the County Board's Environmental Control

Committee I have begun a series of public hearings to elicit comments from County departments, local environmental advocates, and civic groups. Ultimately, my office will be developing an action plan to implement the following initiatives to:

- Increase waste reduction efforts in County facilities
- Buy at least a portion of the County's electricity from green sources
- Buy green vehicles for the County's fleet
- Use rubberized asphalt in the Highway Department
- Expand the green purchasing ordinance to additional products
- Develop model green building codes.

The guiding principle for these initiatives is "sustainability"—the idea

that resources should be used in a way which doesn't negatively impact future generations. In addition to the environmental benefits, many of these initiatives will save money. For example, if the County is using less energy and using less fuel, the cost of County government will decrease. If you would like to participate or attend our next meeting, please contact Jason Liechty in my district office.

For the Forest Preserve District, I have begun working on an ordinance that will officially codify our Land Use Policy and protect our lands from encroachments and other attempts to use public lands for private purposes. The current policy has not been updated since 1962. In addition, the policy is only advisory in nature; by codifying it we will mandate that the

our seniors and long-time residents and lowered our level of diversity in the ward. I am working to ensure that people who want to continue living in Lakeview, are able to do so.

The 44th Ward Community
Directed Development Council continues to be hard at work inventorying the properties of the ward and working to develop a Master Plan for future development. They have also been reviewing major projects underway in the ward.

With the warm weather fast approaching, everyone wants to get outside and enjoy the greenery. We have been working to increase the greenery in our ward. There will be a study done this year at Blaine School for a park on their campus in 2005. The alderman has asked the Chicago Park District to put together a report on green space in the ward, so that they can begin to find ways to add more green space.

Sidewalk Café applications are well underway right now. Any restau-

rant that would like a Sidewalk Café needs to bring the application to the Alderman's office for approval and then it will be submitted to City Council. Sidewalk Café furniture can not be put out until the permit has been paid for and issued by the City's Revenue Department. The Sidewalk Café season runs from April 1st – November 1st. The closing time for Cafes in the 44th Ward is 10pm for Sundays – Thursdays and 11pm for Fridays and Saturdays. Food must be served to patrons using outdoor cafes in conjunction with any alcohol being served.

Another reminder for businesses – In an ongoing effort to keep the side-walks pedestrian friendly, I am taking this opportunity to remind all business owners of the City Ordinance which clearly states that advertising signs (Sandwich Boards) are not allowed on the Public Way. Thank you in advance for your cooperation regarding this matter.

And last, but not least, please remember to register to vote if you

haven't done so already, or you've recently moved. Voting is a responsibility we all share in this democracy we all cherish.


